Legislative advocacy fellowships for high school & college students

JCJ's legislative advocacy fellowships range from a 10-week summer program to a yearlong internship, and provide high school and college-aged participants with a platform to advocate for a more compassionate and equitable world.

JCJ high school and college fellowships encourage the next generation of young leaders to connect with activist peers from around the country, and engage in real-time justice work.

From conducting legislative research to advocating for bills to building coalitions, JCJ fellows develop advocacy and leadership skills that propel them throughout their educational experience and into their desired career path.
